

Getting the Job Done -Hundreds of Donkeys Saved!

<<First Name>>, as you would be aware, we have been on a mission since December 2020 to save 5000 innocent donkeys who were abandoned following closure of a donkey skin slaughterhouse in Shinyanga, Tanzania. With thousands of donkeys in urgent need of food, water, veterinary treatment and relocation to a safe environment, Animal Aid Abroad were quick to step in and support our partner group, Tanzania Humane Charity (TAHUCHA), to care for these donkeys.





Thanks to YOUR generosity, Animal Aid Abroad has also been working hard with TAHUCHA to expand their already-established sanctuary in Bukombe and give them the capacity to host hundreds of extra donkeys who require ongoing care. These donkeys have medical conditions, are weak, old, pregnant or have young foals at foot. Animal Aid Abroad provided all the funding required to purchase an additional 10 acres of land and fencing, which was only made possible due to our incredible donors.

The team have already welcomed 162 donkeys and, now that they have finished building a new stable, trough and water tank, TAHUCHA are **ready to accommodate another 200 rescued animals due to arrive this weekend**. One particularly kind donor, Nigel Madeley, has had the new donkey stable named in his honour! Many of the donkeys who can be rehabilitated will be absorbed back into the Bukombe area where TAHUCHA operates. Here, the team will be able to closely monitor their progress and wellbeing on an ongoing basis.





Although many donkeys have now been translocated from the Shinyanga abattoir back into surrounding villages and markets, hundreds of additional **donkeys were recently discovered and are in dire need of rescuing.** These unfortunate donkeys have been kept hidden away by donkey skin traders in extremely unsuitable enclosures, where they have been forced to stand continuously in deep mud.

Hope for Horses in India

Working equines in India face all manner of serious hazards on a daily basis. From wounds and injuries caused by fencing wire, iron bars or collisions with vehicles, to ruptured tendons due to overwork and overloading, the life of a working equine in India is beset with danger, fear and pain.

Following are just a small number of cases where our partner group, Friendicoes, have come to the rescue. Animal Aid Abroad supports the work they perform treating equines on the streets of New Delhi and educating owners on how to better care for their animals.

Whilst grazing in a field, this horse was injured by sharp fencing wire. The wound was sutured under sedation.





Rest was advised and the horse is now thankfully much more at ease!



Friendicoes visited this sweet donkey working in a brick kiln when she sustained a foot injury.



She was treated on site by the vet team and is now on her way to recovery.



This horse was suffering from allergic dermatitis, caused by unhygienic living conditions.

Treatment involved chlorhexidine solution and oral ivermectin.



The horse's skin is healing well and the owner is thrilled by the improvement.
