Walk Across Australia for Working Animals!

Embarking on the journey of a lifetime, Animal Aid Abroad (AAA)'s founder, Janet Thomas, and her rescue dog Jack, are walking across Australia from Melbourne, Victoria to Perth, Western Australia, to raise much-needed funds and awareness for abused and overworked animals around the globe. Janet set up

AAA in 2007 after returning from working in Egypt and, 13 years later, the charity has grown to support 18 different animal welfare projects across 12 countries in some of the poorest and most challenging regions in the world.

The main goal of the walk is to raise \$250,000, which will cover funding for the 18 partner projects for one year, as well as enabling the construction of an animal shelter in Mannar, Sri Lanka. The secondary goal is to increase awareness of the millions of horses, donkeys, mules, camels and bullocks who are mistreated while doing the work of tractors, trucks and taxis every day in the world's poorest countries.

Reaching Animals in Need in Kurdistan

Over the course of January, Dr Sulaiman of the Kurdistan Organization of Animal Rights Protection (KOARP) used his Animal Aid Abroad-funded car to visit working animals in various villages throughout the Duhok province. He monitors their health status and provides treatment, food and equipment as required, particularly for animals owned by low income families and refugees escaping conflict areas. Last month, Dr Sulaiman managed to treat 20 donkeys, 3 stallions, 3 mares, 2 mules, 35 shepherd dogs, 200 poultry and more than 1242 sheep, goats and cattle. It is interesting to note KOARP is the only group AAA supports that assists working shepherd dogs.

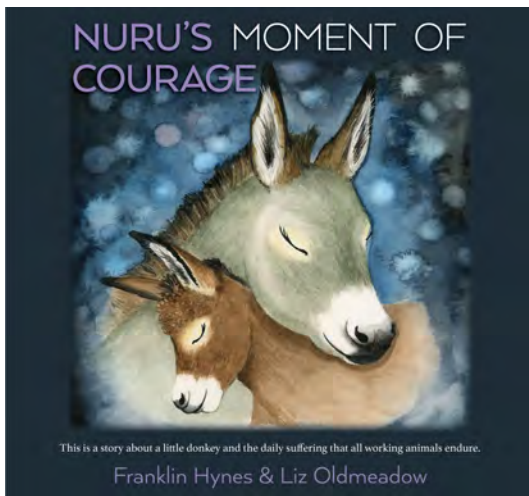
This inspiring story written by Franklin Hynes combines with the beautiful artwork of Liz Oldmeadow to illustrate the daily suffering of all working animals.
